

## National MS Society Awards Dr. Sergio Baranzini the Barancik Prize for Innovation in MS Research



Professor Baranzini is being recognized for his pioneering efforts to integrate "Big Data" to understand complex mechanisms that cause MS.

MIDDLETON, Wis., January 31, 2024 – The National Multiple Sclerosis Society announced Sergio E. Baranzini, PhD, a geneticist, neuroimmunologist, and data scientist at the University of California, San Francisco, is the winner of this year's Barancik Prize for Innovation in MS Research. He is being recognized for his pioneering efforts to integrate vast pools of information ("Big Data") to understand complex mechanisms that cause MS and to develop more precise approaches to stop the disease and end it by prevention.

Baranzini will receive the award and deliver the Prize Lecture at the Americas Committee for Treatment and Research in Multiple Sclerosis (ACTRIMS) Forum on March 1, 2024. Read more about <u>Dr. Baranzini's</u> achievements and findings.
