In addition to attending a series of talks on the topics listed below, participants are invited to participate in a poster session and to attend workshops on grant applications and career trajectories in Multiple Sclerosis (MS) and related research.

About ACTRIMS and the Young Scientist Summit

A core value of ACTRIMS is to mentor and support the careers of students, neurology residents, postdoctoral fellows, and junior faculty interested in clinical neuroimmunology and/or clinical MS, including:

- MS diagnostic criteria,
- Clinical subtypes,
- Epidemiology,
- Human neuropathology,

- Animal models: strengths and weaknesses,
- The current therapeutic landscape in MS,
- Mechanisms of action of disease modifying therapies.

The long-term goal is to bridge the gap between **bench and bedside research**, fostering collaboration between PhD investigators and their physician colleagues.

Eligibility

Applicants may be graduate students (Masters, PhD or MD, PhD), medical students, research associates, postdoctoral fellows, or junior faculty with a research interest in MS.

Participation in the Young Scientist Summit offers:

- 1. A deeper understanding of how research impacts MS patient care.
- 2. Insights into current MS diagnostic and treatment approaches.
- 3. Networking opportunities with peers and experts in the field.
- 4. Guidance on research questions and pathways more likely to drive translational advancements in MS.
