Fellowship Type(s)

The Match includes the following fellowship training program types:

- 1 to 3-year duration
- programs that focus on clinical training or combine clinical and research training
- programs that focus on MS or combine training in MS and other autoimmune neurologic disorders
- programs that focus on adult or pediatric autoimmune neurologic disorders, or include exposure to both
- programs that focus on neurologic or rehabilitation aspects of autoimmune neurologic disorders, or include exposure to both

At this time, the Match does not include fellowships in Autoimmune Neurology exclusively. Also, research-focused fellowships (requiring a specific mentor or working on a specific grant) will continue to be separate.

Eligibility Requirements

Applicants must:

- hold an MD/DO or equivalent medical degree
- be eligible to practice medicine in the United States
- have completed a Neurology, Pediatric Neurology or PM&R residency

Applicants holding J1 or H1b visas may apply, but not all programs are able to sponsor visas. Applicants must ensure that the institutions to which they are applying can support their visa status.

Application Period

Applications will be open from September 1 - December 1* of 2023 with matches provided in March of 2024.

*December 1st is the suggested end date for applications. Applications that come in after December 1st will be reviewed at the discretion of individual programs.

Fees

Applicant fees:

The initial applicant registration fee is \$150.

Application distribution fees are pro-rated according to the number of programs to which the applicant applies.

Application distribution list fees for applicants are as follows:

1-10 programs \$60 flat fee 11-20 programs \$10/program 21-30 programs \$15/program 31-40 programs \$20/program 41 or more \$35/program

Applications Requirements

The SF Match will collect applications centrally via the Central Application Service (CAS) and provide them to all programs to which the applicant applies. Programs will receive applications as they are submitted during the application period.

Applicants may rank as many programs as they have applied to.

A complete application to Neuroimmunology Fellowship programs must include:

- 1. CAS Application:
 - o Complete the Personal Info form
 - Required Supplemental form (submission required)
- 2. Personal Statement
- 3. Medical School Transcripts
- 4. USMLE Step 1/COMLEX Level 1 or equivalent
- 5. USMLE Step 2/COMLEX Level 2 or equivalent
- 6. USMLE Step 3/COMLEX Level 3 or equivalent
- 7. Letters of Reference (3)
 - o The authors will be uploading letters directly to the applicants' accounts.
 - After applicants register, they will send requests for letters of recommendation via the SF Match system.
 - o The letter writers will receive the requests via email with instructions to upload the letters.
 - Applicants will not be able to see the contents of the letters but will be able to monitor their status (receive notifications when letters are uploaded as well as check their status when they log in).
 - They can request and receive an unlimited number of letters but will be assigning three (3) to each program they apply.
